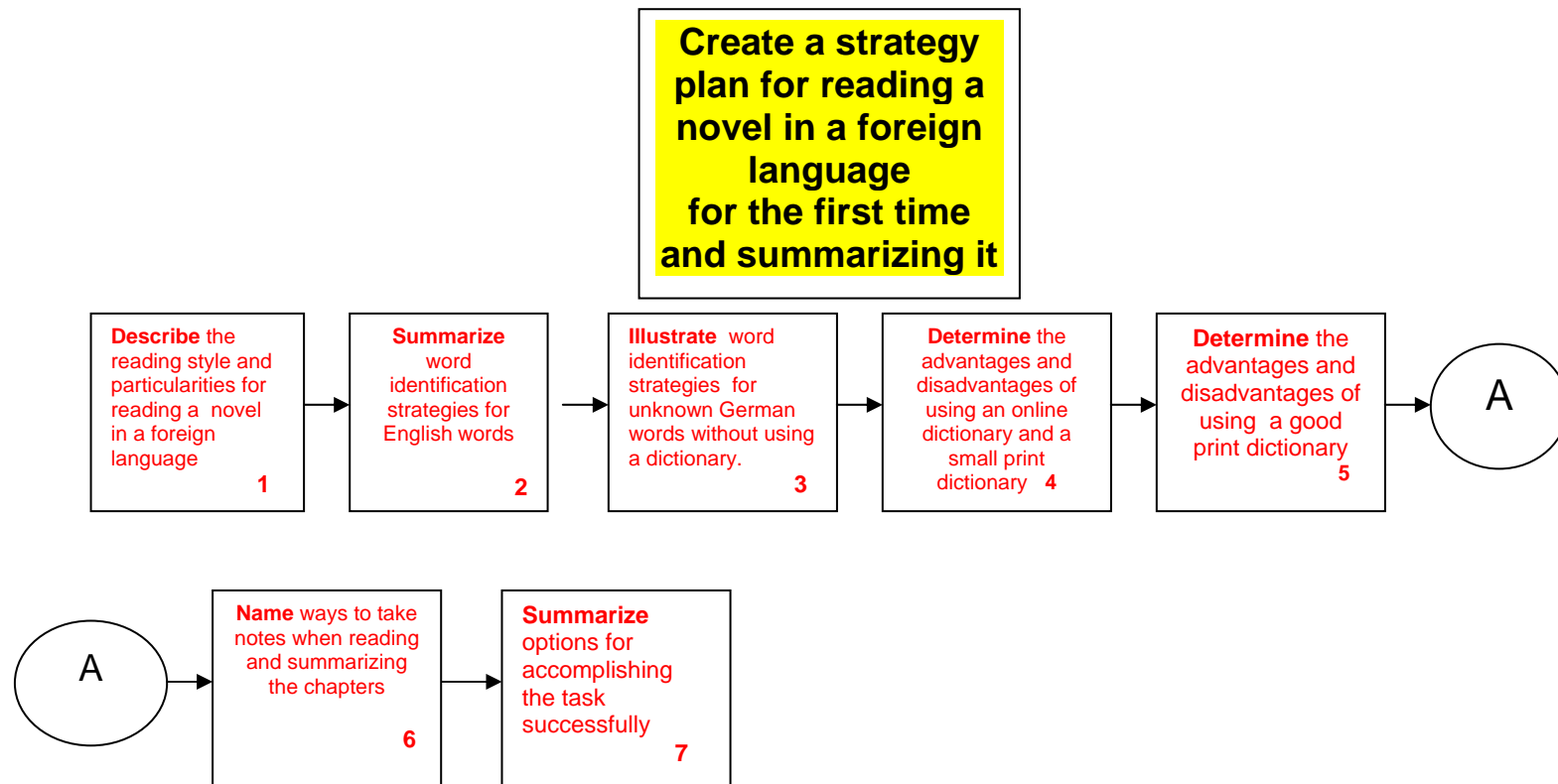

Cluster information for 1.1. and 1.2.
1.1: Classify Information sheets, novels, TV-programs, manuals, newspaper articles, opinion piece, poem, magazine article, weather report, train timetable, recipe, e-mail from a friend
1.2: Define skimming (reading rapidly for the main points)
Define scanning (reading rapidly to find a specific information)
Define intensive Reading (reading a short text for detailed information)
Define extensive reading (reading a longer text often for pleasure – emphasis overall meaning)

Cluster information for 1.5.
1.5.1 Explain that it takes much longer to read a novel in a foreign language than reading a novel in your native language
1.5.2. Explain that you don't have to understand every word
1.5.3. Explain that you have to decide if you need to understand the word to grasp the gist of the main points
1.5.4. Explain that an unknown word that you see often in the text should be looked up
